SEVERITY	ISSUE & HOW TO FIX	COUNT
CRITICAL	Images missing alt text Screen-reader users can't tell what the image shows. Fix: Add a descriptive alt attribute to each image (alt="" for purely decorative ones). WCAG 1.1.1	12
CRITICAL	Form fields with no label Users can't tell what to type; screen readers announce nothing. Fix: Associate a <label> with every input (or use aria-label). WCAG 4.1.2	4
SERIOUS	Low colour contrast Text is hard to read for low-vision users and in sunlight. Fix: Increase contrast to at least 4.5:1 for normal text (3:1 for large text). WCAG 1.4.3	27
SERIOUS	Links with no readable text A screen reader announces an empty or "click here" link with no destination. Fix: Give every link meaningful text, or an aria-label describing where it goes. WCAG 2.4.4 · WCAG 4.1.2	6

SEVERITY	ISSUE & HOW TO FIX	COUNT
SERIOUS	Tap targets too small Small buttons/links are hard to tap for people with motor difficulties. Fix: Make interactive targets at least 24×24px, or add spacing around them. WCAG 2.5.8	14
MODERATE	Headings out of order Screen-reader users navigate by headings; skipped levels are confusing. Fix: Use headings in logical order (don't jump from H1 to H4). Best practice	9
